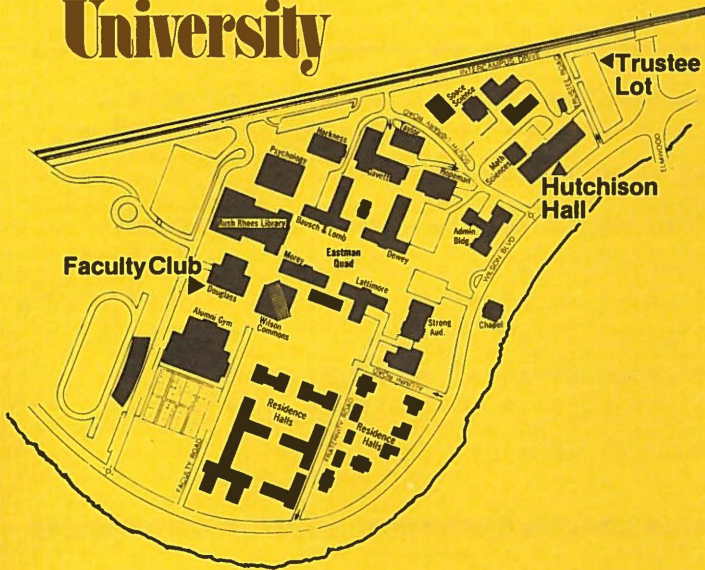

The University of Rochester is pleased to present the second part of its special program featuring ten distinguished faculty members in a series of special lectures open to the community.

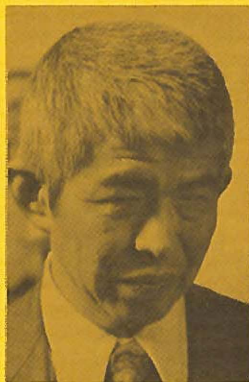
These five lectures will be presented in early 1977; the first five were held in late 1976.

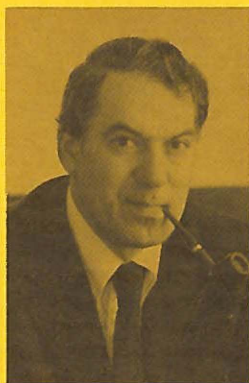


**Walter Oi, Professor and Chairman of Economics: "Safety at Any Price?"**

Professor Oi, a nationally known authority on applied economic theory and labor and transportation economics, was staff economist for the President's Commission on an All-Volunteer Armed Force.

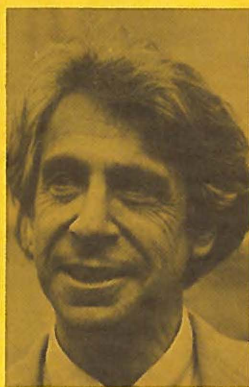


**George Engel, Professor of Psychiatry and of Medicine: "The Care of the Patient: Art or Science?"**

**Anthony Hecht, John H. Deane Professor of Rhetoric and Poetry: "Readings from 'Millions of Strange Shadows' "**

Professor Hecht, a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, won the 1968 Pulitzer Prize for poetry and was nominated for a National Book Award in 1974. "Millions of Strange Shadows," his latest work, will be published in the United States and England early in 1977.
